1. Reconnaissance – Thursday 14 July 2011

Reminders –

- Competitors report to the start of SS 10/14 Waipu Gorge between 07.30 - 07.45hrs (Follow the Day 1 Road Book from Whangarei start & remain on HW 1 to Waipu Gorge Road). Complete SS 10/14 Waipu Gorge & SS 11/15 Batley and return to the start of SS 10/14 Waipu Gorge (08.45 – 09.00hrs) via Whakapirau Road, HW12 & HW 1 for the second loop. NOTE: fuel and food is available at Noel Radd Caltex, Maungaturoto.
- After completing the second loop of SS10/14 Waipu Gorge & SS11/15 Batley use the Road Book to travel to the start of SS 12/16 Wairere (09.50 – 10.05hrs)
At the finish of SS12/16 Wairere use the Road Book pages 23/24 to travel to the start of SS2/6 Bull (10.15 – 10.30hrs).
- After completing the second loop of SS12/16 Wairere & SS2/6 Bull use the Road Book to travel to SS3/7 Cassidy (13.15 – 13.30hrs) NOTE: fuel and food is available at Paparoa
After completing the first pass of SS3/7 Cassidy travel north on Paparoa Oakleigh Road to turn right into Ruarangi Road (start of SS9/13 Waipu Caves 13.50 – 14.05hrs)
After completing SS9/13 Waipu Caves turn right (south) at the HW 1 junction to the start of SS1/5 Brooks (Road Book page 18 Finlayson Brook Road) (14.30 – 14.45hrs)
After completing SS1/5 Brooks turn left onto Paparoa Oakleigh Road and then immediately right into Central Road to return to the start of SS3/7 Cassidy for the second loop (14.50 – 15.05hrs)
- Officials will be travelling in the convoy to assist competitors.
- Competitors are not to overtake the lead car.
- Competitors must enter each special stage in accordance with the official time schedule.
- No competitor may enter any special stage AFTER the Sweeper car.
- Rally HQ will be operational. If you have a problem please telephone 09 438 8769.

2. Intoxicants and Drugs

Competitors entered in the APRC will have received an FIA Booklet “FIA Race True Anti Doping Campaign. All competitors are urged to read MotorSport New Zealand Appendix One – Schedule D “Intoxicants and Drugs” Pursuant to Article 38 of the National Sporting Code, all competitors are subject to the international rules covering the use of drugs in sport.

The list of prohibited substances published by the World Anti-Doping Agency and any additional provisions, are set out on the Drug Free Sport NZ website.

Further enquiries about forbidden substances can be obtained by contacting the agency's Hotline 0800 DRUG FREE (0800 378 437). The reference list of substances is regularly updated. Competitors can also obtain a booklet from Drug Free Sport NZ entitled "Drug Testing – Athlete Rights and Responsibilities"
